What if I am not a Tower Hamlets resident but would like a place at a Tower Hamlets school? You can submit an online application via the E-admissions website:

www.eadmissions.org.uk naming Tower Hamlets schools. What if my child has an **Education, Health & Care Plan** (EHCP)? The application process is different for children with an EHCP and you do not apply online. Contact the SEN team for more information. What if I apply late? It's really important that you make your application before the closing date otherwise your application will not be considered until all on time applicants have received their outcomes and the school may then be full.

Is my child guaranteed a place at one of our preferred schools? Most families will be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, but this cannot be guaranteed. When a school receives more applications than the number of places available, not all children can be admitted. Therefore, please fully consider the likelihood of your child getting a place at a preferred school before you make your application. Only naming one school does not increase your chances of being offered the school. If my child is already in the school's nursery class, is there an automatic right to a place in the school's reception class? When parents/carers apply for their children to start reception, no priority is given to children that attend the nursery of the school. The decision on whether a place can be offered will be made in accordance with the school's admission policy. How will I be notified about the outcome of my application? You will receive an email and a letter on National Offer Day.







FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Did you know the government gives additional funding to schools for those children entitled to free school meals (pupil premium)?

Schools use this money to obtain additional staff and resources that help improve the quality of education.

To find out whether your child qualifies for pupil premium, and hence whether their school would receive additional funding, please click the link below and complete the form.

In addition, the following pupils will be protected against losing their free school meals (pupil premium) as follows:

- Pupils who were eligible on 1 April 2018, or who became eligible since then, continue to receive free meals, even if their household is no longer eligible under the benefits/low-earnings criteria, up until March 2025 and then until the end of their phase of education
- New applicants for free school meals on or after 1 April 2018, who are in receipt
 of Universal Credit and have earnings above the earned income threshold, will
 not be eligible for free school meals

The Universal Credit rollout is currently expected to complete in March 2025

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

what does it mean?

Schools may be entitled to extra funding for your child if you meet certain eligibility criteria. This extra funding is called Pupil Premium. The council still needs to identify eligible children to allocate Pupil Premium funding correctly.

Parent/carers do not have to do anything if:

- your child is already recorded as eligible to receive the benefit of free school meals at their school
- you do not receive any benefits and have an annual gross income of more than £16,190.

If you receive any of the following benefits but your child has not received free school meals in the past, you must complete your <u>child's application form</u>.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (if you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

If this is not possible, call us on 020 7364 5001 and we can assist you. If you do not apply, your child/children's school may miss out on vital funding. Information that parent/carers need to share:

- child's name, date of birth and school
- evidence of the parent's (or guardian's) income (unless this has been provided already) and national insurance details.
